For the period this report covers, the company successfully engaged 736 young people, disabled people, new and emerging artists and vulnerable/at risk adults in artistic activity including bespoke delivery of drama and theatrical workshops and training sessions Black Sheep Collective continued to develop new and challenging fringe arts work, performing in locations across the UK

We were commissioned by England Rugby, as the only Social Enterprise supplier to the Rugby World Cup tournament three matches held in Milton Keynes, to setup and deliver spectator experiences and street arts performances at two key footprints (MK Central Station and Stadium MK) for arriving fans This opportunity facilitated 100 hours of volunteering for young people and 54 performance hours in the public realm for community and professional artists Much of this work broke new ground and enabled the city's planners and tourism board to actively promote Milton Keynes as a destination and inform the programme for the upcoming MK 50th Anniversary year (2017) This work has led to the the company being asked to inform the new street arts and busking policies for Central Milton Keynes with MK Council, Thames Valley Police, Commercial Landowners and Local Tourist Board

Black Sheep Collective CIC also delivered an inspiring programme under the BBC's Get Creative initiative, based on the 150th Anniversary of "Alice in Wonderland" The project included a two night fringe theatre show with community actors and new artists as well as several educational workshops for school children The show's cast was made up of vulnerable/at risk people, disabled people, students and young people as well as elderly people The three workshops had 30 participants and were supported by 5 volunteers, which generated 30 volunteering hours The show was performed in a community theatre and saw audience figures of 750 (the highest attendance for fringe/community theatre recorded at this venue) This project was in partnership with newly formed CIO, Stantonbury Arts & Leisure Trust (Theatre management), who subsequently invited one of the Directors of Black Sheep Collective CIC to join their Trustee Board moving forward, to aid and inform their future programming ensuring that community access to arts provision remained a key focus for the CIO

All projects were designed and implemented with input and engagement from participants, parents/guardians, volunteers and community members. In the case of the street arts work for the Rugby World Cup, stakeholder engagement included Thames Valley Police, Milton Keynes Council and England Rugby. The educational programme for the "Alice in Wonderland" project engaged school students, charity (CIO) staff and trustees and Milton Keynes Council Youth Services' staff.




